Kingsman Public Charter School offers a comprehensive meal program for all students. Our school is a proud participant in the School Breakfast Program, the National School Lunch Program, and the Afterschool Snack Program. The program enhances children's learning abilities by providing free comprehensive meals. Studies have shown that children whose nutritional needs are met have fewer attendance and discipline problems. These students are more attentive in class when they are provided with a balanced breakfast and lunch. A nutritional school breakfast and lunch is not only essential to academic achievement, it is also part of a good education.

Due to COVID-19, Kingsman Academy offered distance learning for school-year 2020-21 and provided food boxes with 5 breakfasts and 5 lunches weekly to students for pick-up. For school-year 2021-22, Kingsman Academy will be re-opening with a hybrid model. Students attending in person will receive meals and a snack daily in their learning pods or have the option of eating in small groups with their program cohorts. Students electing to attend virtually will have the opportunity to pick up one week's worth of meals and snacks, similar to school year 2020-21.

District of Columbia Human Rights Act
